

**Dallas Association of Young Lawyers Foundation  
Grants Awarded 2020**

Through the generous support from the Dallas legal community, the DAYL Foundation awarded \$26,050 in grants in 2020 to eleven organizations. The DAYL Foundation awards grants to projects that have a primary focus or emphasis on one of these program areas:

- 1) Law related scholarship and education promoting knowledge and awareness of the rule of law;
- 2) Charitable and legal aid for the public, including improving the delivery of legal services to the indigent and improving the administration of justice;
- 3) Foster honor, integrity and public confidence in the profession of law;
- 4) To assist the legal profession by enhancing the quality of client services and improving the self-regulation of the profession; and/or
- 5) Historical preservation and observances.

The following organizations received a grant from the DAYL Foundation in 2020.

<b>Dallas CASA</b>	\$2,800
A grant was provided to help fund printing and assembly costs for workbooks and training manuals for volunteers during training.	
<b>Gift of Adoption</b>	\$1,500
A grant was provided to pay for legal fees associated with the adoption of vulnerable children.	
<b>Housing Crisis Center</b>	\$4,000
A grant was provided to assist with funding a legal hotline and costs associated with the legal clinic.	
<b>Human Rights Initiative of North Texas, Inc.</b>	\$3,500
A grant was provided to help HRI contract with professional interpreters.	
<b>Legacy Family Court Foundation, Inc.</b>	\$2,500
A grant was provided to help fund an eighteen-month alcohol and substance abuse program for parents whose children have been removed from their care.	
<b>Legal Hospice of Texas</b>	\$1,000
A grant was provided to help fund legal services to low-income individuals with terminal illnesses or HIV/AIDS disease.	
<b>Mosaic Family Services</b>	\$3,000
A grant provided to support interpretation costs and legal fees for victims of domestic violence and abuse.	
<b>Solar Prep for Boys</b>	\$3,000
A grant was provided to the PTA to fund a school field trip to the Texas Capitol for eighty students.	
<b>Unlocking DOORS Texas Reentry Network (dba DOORS)</b>	\$2,000
A grant was provided to fund fees and symposium materials for the 2020 Texas Reentry Symposium.

A grant was provided to cover entry fees for debate and mock trial program.
