

**Dallas Association of Young Lawyers Foundation  
Grants Awarded 2022**

Through the generous support from the Dallas legal community, the DAYL Foundation awarded \$37,260 in grants in 2022 to sixteen organizations. The DAYL Foundation awards grants to projects that have a primary focus or emphasis on one of these program areas:

1. Law-related scholarship and education promoting knowledge and awareness of the rule of law;
2. Charitable and legal aid for the public, including improving the delivery of legal services to the indigent and improving the administration of justice; and/or
3. Foster honor, integrity, and public confidence in the profession of law.

The following organizations received a grant from the DAYL Foundation in 2022.

<b>Act for Justice</b>	\$3,000
A grant was provided to gather open records and research to support your legal advocacy program's casework docket and gather evidence for nuisance abatement casework.	
<b>CASA of Collin County</b>	\$1,700
A grant was provided to assist with expenses related to child advocacy programs, including fingerprints and DMV reports.	
<b>Catholic Charities of Dallas</b>	\$500
A grant was provided to support legal workshops to assist Cuban nationals applying for work permits and permanent residency.	
<b>Council on American Islamic Relations (CAIR)</b>	\$3,000
A grant was provided to be used to put together an outreach toolbox to help share information about their programs and services more effectively.	
<b>Creekview High School</b>	\$2,000
A grant was provided to help cover travel expenses (hotel, airfare, car rental) for the students' legal education events, such as moot court competitions, mock trial competitions, and academy field trips.	
<b>Dallas CASA</b>	\$2,000
A grant was provided to cover background checks and fingerprinting for CASA volunteer advocate applicants.	
<b>Gift of Adoption</b>	\$2,500
A grant was provided to cover the final legal fees (courtroom and agency expenses) to close the adoption of a child.	
<b>Housing Crisis Center</b>	\$500
A grant was provided to help fund a portion of the costs to provide the legal clinic.	
<b>Human Rights Initiative</b>	\$3,500
A grant was provided to provide funding for a fingerprint machine and related supplies.	
<b>IGNITE</b>	\$1,500
A grant was provided to help grow and sustain ten student-led high school and college chapters to promote civic engagement, voter registration drives, ballot education events, and policy workshop debates.	
<b>Judge Barefoot Sanders Law Magnet</b>	\$3,000
A grant was given to provide partial scholarships for students to participate in the Trial Advocacy & Public Speaking Program.	

<b>Mosaic Family Services</b>	\$1,500
A grant was provided to help pay for interpretation costs and legal fees for victims of domestic violence and abuse.	
<b>OneCommunityUSA</b>	\$3,000
A grant was provided to help fund the expansion of the ShopTalk program throughout the DFW metroplex.	
<b>Texas Accountants and Lawyers for the Arts</b>	\$1,500
A grant was provided to help with funding for two seminars, one covering patent law issues and one covering copyright for creatives.	
<b>YMCA of Metropolitan Dallas</b>	\$3,060
A grant was provided to pay for partial scholarships for middle and high school students participating in the YMCA Dallas Youth and Government program.	
<b>Young Women's Preparatory Network</b>	\$5,000
A grant was provided to pay for students to enter various tournaments and for paying judging fees.
